GUIDELINES TO CONTRIBUTORS

1. About the manuscript

- a. Manuscript must be the original work(s) of the author(s). Authors and co-authors must consent to their manuscript being submitted to TRES for publication.
- b. All manuscripts must be written in English Language.
- c. Abstracts should be typed single line spacing, NOT italicized and NOT more than 250 words
- d. Following the abstract, there could be 3-4 keywords which conceptualized the content of the manuscript.
- e. The manuscript should be typed on A4 size paper, 1.5 line-spacing, with Times New Roman, font 12 and not more than 15pages.
- f. The style, Tables, Figures and References should conform to the APA format (Current edition)

2. Manuscript submission format

- a. All manuscripts must be;
 - i. submitted electronically in Microsoft Word as an e-mail attachment
 - ii. submitted electronically either online using this link: www.tresj.org or through e-mail attachment to info@tresj.org
 - b. On top of the abstract page must be written the paper title, full names of the author(s), e-mail address (es), telephone numbers (optional) and institutional affiliations.
 - c. Author(s)' academic qualification must be indicated in a parenthesis just in front of the author(s) name e.g Oke, N.U (Ph.D, M.Sc, Prof). please use comma to indicate your surname for clarity purpose.
 - d. An article that has multiple authors, should please indicate the corresponding author.
 - e. Submission is continuous and articles received late will be reviewed and published in the immediate next edition.
